




HERE ARE SOME OF THE P3-4 STUDENTS WITH THEIR 'NAME OUR LYNX' PROJECT ARTWORK.

IN OUR NURSERY WE HAVE HAD A VISIT FROM THE NATIONAL TRUST AND THE RANGER SERVICE WHERE WE LEARNED ABOUT COMPASSES AND NAVIGATION. WE ENJOYED OUTDOOR LEARNING WITH THE RANGER AND LINKED THIS TO OUR STORY- 'WE'RE GOING ON A BEAR HUNT'; WHERE THE CHILDREN CREATED THEIR OWN MAPS AND WENT ON AN ACTUAL BEAR HUNT! WE HAVE ENJOYED SPENDING TIME OUTDOORS IN THE WOODS, EXPLORING MINIBEASTS AND BUILDING DENS. WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING HOW TO LOOK AFTER OURSELVES OUTDOORS INCLUDING SUN SAFETY.

WE HAVE ENJOYED LEARNING ABOUT DINOSAURS AND HAVE USED MIXED MEDIA
TO CREATE DINOSAUR FOOTPRINTS, ECOSYSTEMS AND LEARN ABOUT
PREHISTORIC CREATURES.

THE CHILDREN HAVE LEARNED ABOUT THE LIFE CYCLE OF BUTTERFLIES, AND WE HAVE WATCHED OUR VERY OWN CATERPILLARS MAKE THE TRANSFORMATION INTO CHRYSALIS AND THE CYCLE WILL BE COMPLETE WITH RELEASING OUR BUTTERFLIES.

WE HAVE USED CRAFTS AND MIXED MEDIA TO LINK THIS TO WHAT WE HAVE SEEN CREATING OUR OWN LIFE CYCLE OF A BUTTERFLY.

WE HAVE BEEN LOOKING AT OUR ENVIRONMENT AND EXPLORED PLANT LIFE AND HAVE SOWN OUR OWN SEEDS (SUNFLOWERS, TOMATOES, STRAWBERRIES, AND ROCKET) AND LEARNED HOW TO CARE FOR THESE AND WATCHED THEM GRADUALLY RIPEN AND BEAR FRUIT.

THE CHILDREN HAVE BEEN DEVELOPING OUR LITERACY, FINE MOTOR, AND NUMERACY SKILLS WITH A VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES INCLUDING PATTERNS AND SEQUENCING, LETTER AND NUMBER SORTING AND FORMATION AND HAVE LINKED THESE INTO TO OUR TOPIC OF DINOSAURS AND THE LIFE CYCLE OF A BUTTERFLY.


CREATING DIGITAL ARTWORK WITH CHROME CANVAS
