P4-7 STEM 'Robots and Mathematics' Module

The P4-7 students enjoyed participating in a 'Robots and Mathematics' session, run by the Science Skills Academy. The module had an emphasis on mathematical discussions and exploration of strategies to calculate the perimeter of two-dimensional shapes.

Firstly, they worked in pairs to calculate the circumference of a wheel and then calculated and tested how far a robot will travel when programmed to rotate its wheels a certain number of times. They were then asked to present their strategies to the other pupils.



Ellie & Isla, winners of the S2 rocket project said this about their experience....



On blustery day in November, four of our fittest athletes competed against Lochaber schools in the annual 'Leanachan Challenge' at Nevis Range, Fort William. The track was very muddy but all of our competitors ran their very best. Kaiden Springett S2, and Eddie Cabotage S1, ran very quick times and competed well. Lucas Allen S2, achieved 3rd place in the S1/2 category and Peter Prokop, S6, achieved 2nd place in the S5/6 category. All competitors worked hard and perfectly demonstrated our value of resilience in what is known to be a very tough sport. Well done.



The next term will bring some challenges for our Senior Phase pupils, however I am confident that they will all rise up to it!

The first opportunity to demonstrate their abilities will be during the prelim session which will begin on the 12th of January.

Our pupils and teachers have been working really hard to prepare for this occasion.

Prelims are really important as it helps pupils to identify their abilities in each subject and is used to create learning targets for the remainder of the year. They also serve as a rehearsal for the main SQA exams which begin at the end of April.

We have employed SQA invigilators to help replicate those exams to allow our pupils to become comfortable and familiar in that environment. To help achieve success, I would like parents to help encourage good study habits at home to supplement and consolidate good learning in the classroom.

We have subscribed to online revision platforms such as Heriot Watt Scholar, Achieve and E-Sgoil to help our pupils. Further information can be accessed in their Guidance google classrooms. In between exams, pupils are expected to follow their timetable and continue learning with their teacher in class.


